EVENT CONDITIONS

Eligibility	All competitors shall be registered with their National Federation to be eligible to compete (World Aquatics Rule GR1.1)	
Event Conditions	1.0 General	
	1.1	A diver is permitted to enter both the Age Group event and Open events.
	1.2	There will be 1m, 3m and Platform individual events as well as 3m and Platform synchronised events. Platform heights of 5m, 7.5m and/or 10m will be permitted.
	1.3	In all events, forward and reverse dives on springboard will be performed with a running start.
	1.4	Divers must be supervised by a Level 2 (or equivalent) Diving Coach in the Pool and Dry Land area.
	1.5 No dive may be repeated in a list of dives.	
	1.6	Minimum age for competitors is 10 years on 31 December in the year of competition. Divers aged 10 to 13 years may dive "up" to Group B.
	1.7a Synchronised events will be straight finals.	
	1.7b	Open Finals Qualifiers
		 The top 6 ranked Open Men and Women after the preliminary round go through to final The top 6 ranked in each Age Group after the preliminary round go through to the respective final

Technical Meeting	Thursday 5 th February 2026 at 18:00 in Meeting Room 2. At least one representative from each Club is required to attend. A Judges meeting will follow the Technical Meeting.
Coaches/Team Staff Social	The event organisers would like to extend an invitation to all the coaches and team staff to attend a social gathering following the Technical Meeting on Thursday 5 th February. There will be an optional torch light walk up Arthur's Seat, finishing at the Sheep's Heid Inn for refreshments and a game of skittles! When booking training slots please indicate how many coaches/team staff will attend the social gathering.
Judging	All diving clubs/teams attending are requested to supply at least one judge. This is to ensure the smooth running of the event and to help us deliver the synchro events and concurrent Age Group events. If you are unable to provide a judge, please make Vicki Tomlinson aware when you are arranging training.
Awards & Presentation	All events are 'open' and, in accordance with SASA company rule 4.6.1, Gold, Silver and Bronze will be presented for all events. A Gold only will be presented to the Scottish (National) Champion provided that they are not also the Open Champion (i.e. when the Scottish and Open Champion is the same person, only one medal will be presented).
Eligibility to Compete	 All competitors must be registered with their National Federation to be eligible to compete. To compete for a Scottish Club or Team at Scottish National Open Championships, competitors must be registered with the Scottish Amateur Swimming Association and must have paid their current registration fee. Athletes with Scottish eligibility training outside Scotland and
	wishing to be considered for National Selection must be registered with Scottish Swimming (C3.5.1).
Event Regulations	Entry and Entries to all events is expressly subject to the Event Regulations on our website which can be found here and may, where appropriate, also require compliance with the facility provider's regulations.
	Scottish Swimming reserves absolutely the right to eject from events any person failing to comply with each and all of the Event Regulations.
Media & Photography Information	Throughout this event Scottish Swimming may have a number of authorised media partners taking static photographs and video footage. These images are intended solely for the purposes of promotion and celebration of the activities and may include live streaming on the internet. Images will be made available to our media partners and uploaded to our website and our social network sites.
	Should any competitor wish not to be photographed please <u>complete this</u> <u>form</u> . If at any time a competitor wishes a static image to be removed from our website, 7 days' notice must be given to Scottish Swimming after which the data will be removed.

Safeguarding	The primary safeguarding point of contact for the event in relation to wellbeing & protection matters or accidents is the event Meet Director. The secondary point of contact is the Scottish Swimming Safeguarding Manager.	
Transgender & Non-Binary	The Scottish Swimming Transgender & Non-Binary Competition Policy was implemented nationally across all aquatics sports on the 1st January 2024. The policy and FAQs can be found here . Any policy related matters that arise during the event should be reported to and will be recorded by the Meet Convenor/Lead Referee and these matters will be communicated to and managed post event by the relevant Scottish Swimming Staff. At no point will members be challenged on the day of a competition with any matters being resolved post event. By entering the Female category, athletes are therefore confirming their birth sex is female and are eligible to compete in the Female category.	
Team Staff Information/ Accreditation	A Scottish Swimming Diving accreditation pass is required for any coach/chaperone/team manager wishing access to changing rooms and poolside during the Meet. Without a valid pass any coach/chaperone/team manager will NOT be permitted in the changing rooms or on poolside.	
	All passes must be worn by all team personnel and made visible at all times. Passes will be emailed to the individual prior to the event where they must be printed and brought to the event. Here they will be issued with a plastic wallet and lanyard.

 Coaches/Chaperones applying for passes from outside the UK should make arrangements for their National Governing Body to forward a letter of declaration confirming that all applicants have conformed with their 'home country's' policy concerning child protection.
